Through the years I have been involved in the "Memory Walk" for Alzheimer's in Indianapolis. I have devoted a lot of my continuing education hours to issues of caring for those stricken with this challenging disease. I've been involved in the development of a late stage unit and programming for an early and mid-stage unit during my long-term-care career.

I have poured my heart and passion into understanding the disease. My Grandma Mary had Alzheimer's the last 15 or so years of her life. She was a remarkable person who was the Valedictorian of her class. She had a large influence in my life for many years. Grandma attended Piqua School of nursing in Ohio. When I was growing up, she was the nurse at my doctor's office. She lived out her last years in a Mennonite facility in Ohio.

My concern and compassion for those living with diseases of dementia are a result of my love of her and my desire to bring hope and healing to families.

The Indiana Masonic Home staff will create a special environment for those living in the early and intermediate stages of the disease. Our goal is to be comforting and empathetic, while also being inspiring, loving, and intellectually stimulating. If you have ideas regarding the new unit, please share with Dawn, myself, or any other staff member whose ear you can bend. Together we will create a world class state-of-the-art facility.
